



Wildfire & Smoke Events

Community Supply Donation Guide

During wildfire season, KBT-ESF may stage at community locations to support evacuation assistance, welfare checks, and resource distribution. Smoke events can affect entire regions for days at a time, impacting people who never see a flame. The items below help us support affected community members effectively.

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION

- **N95 or KN95 masks**

Individually packaged. The most critical donation during any smoke event. Standard surgical masks do not filter smoke particulates effectively.

- **Eye drops — preservative-free**

Smoke causes significant eye irritation. Refresh or similar brands.

WATER & NUTRITION

- **Bottled water**

Sealed cases or individual bottles. Staying well-hydrated reduces the effects of smoke inhalation.

- **Sealed snack foods**

Individually wrapped items that can be distributed quickly at a staging site.

- **Electrolyte drinks**

Useful during prolonged exposure to heat and smoke.

PERSONAL & HOUSEHOLD

- **Portable phone chargers / power banks**

Evacuees often lose power access for extended periods.

- **Pet supplies**

Carriers, food, collapsible water bowls. Many evacuating families have animals.

- **Plastic sheeting & painter's tape**

For sealing windows and doors to reduce indoor smoke infiltration.

- **HEPA air purifier filters**

If available — these are often in short supply during smoke events.

COMFORT & SUPPORT

- **Blankets or sleeping bags**

For individuals displaced from their homes.

- **Hygiene supplies**

Travel-size toothbrush, soap, deodorant, and feminine products.
